


Growth

 In less than 30 years the number of adherents to Islam has tripled.

- In 1982 there were 450 million, today 1.5 billion worldwide
- 1 out of every 4 people are Muslims

 - An exertion to convert unbelievers


Background - Birth

570 AD Muhammad was born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia



Background - Revelation


at the age of 40, while meditating in a cave on Mt. Hira, received revelation from the angel Gabriel.



Background - Message

Muhammad, as a prophet, began preaching two fold message

- There is only one God to whose will people must submit
- 2. There will be a day of judgment based on whether or not one has obeyed God



Background - Opposition

Muhammad fled Mecca in 622 AD to escape assassination

He fled 250 miles north to Medina

Hijra = Muhammad's migration to Medina




Background

8 years later in 630 AD, with 10,000 men, Muhammad invaded Mecca and conquered it without a fight.

He cleansed the Ka'ba of idols and dedicated it to Allah.

1. Belief in One God, Allah

Allah is an Arabic word which means "God"

- The Quran teaches that Allah is just, all-knowing, mighty, compassionate, merciful, sovereign, and even loving.
 - This has led some to think that Allah and Jehovah are the same.
 - Not true

The Bible Teaches that God is Triune

One God
(Deuteronomy 6:4),
yet three distinct
persons who are divine
(John 1:1, Acts 5:3-4)



Quran: Allah does not love sinners

Sura 2:276 says...

"Allah does not love any ungrateful sinner."

Sura 3:32 says...

"surely Allah does not love the unbelievers."

Sura 4:36 says...

"surely Allah does not love him who is proud."

Sura 6:141 says...

"surely He does not love the extravagant."

Bible: God loves the world

John 3:16

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Romans 5:8


But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

2. Belief in Prophets

Muslims believe that Allah has sent 124,000 different prophets to mankind down through the ages

Even Biblical characters such as Abraham, Moses, David, Elijah, John the Baptist, and Jesus, make their list of prophets. [see sura 6:84-86]

The last and most respected of all Allah's prophets, is Muhammad.



3. Belief in Angels

Muslims believe angels function as guardians, recorders, and messengers for Allah.

Muslims believe that each person has two angels, one on his right who records his good deeds and one on his left who records the bad deeds (Sura 50:17).



4. Belief in Holy Books

Muslims believe that Allah has given 4 books to mankind:

- 1. The Law of Moses
- 2. The Psalms of David
- 3. The Gospel of Jesus
- 4. The Qur'an of Muhammad

Manuscript Evidence for the Bible


Today there survives more than 24,000 partial and complete, ancient handwritten manuscript copies of the New Testament.

An examination of these manuscripts by scholars and textual critics has verified that the Bible we have in our possession today is the same Bible that the early church possessed 2,000 years ago.



The Early Church Fathers

In their writings, they quoted the New Testament alone 86,000 times! In fact, they referred to it so often and so thoroughly that textual critics can reconstruct the entire New Testament (except eleven verses) from their quotes.

5. Belief in Final Judgment

The Qur'an teaches that all human beings will be physically resurrected on what it calls "the Last Day."

A person's life will be examined and they will be permitted to spend eternity in heaven (sura 4:57) Or hell (sura 4:56; 14:48-51).

5 Pillars of Islam



5 Pillars of Islam

1. Confession

"There is no God but Allah, and Muhammad is his prophet."

This declaration of faith is called the "shahada" and is repeated constantly by faithful Muslims.

5 Pillars of Islam

2. Prayer

Muslims are required to pray at 5 specific times a day, facing Mecca.

Daybreak, noon, mid-afternoon, after sunset, early evening



3. Giving

Muslims are required to give 2.5% to help the poor and for emergency situations.



4. Fasting

In the month of Ramadan, the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, Muslims fast from sunrise until sundown (Sura 2:183-185).

Ramadan is the month that Muslims believe Muhammad first received the revelation of the Qur'an.



5. Pilgrimage Hajj

It is required within Islam that all who are physically and financially able go to Mecca at least once in their lifetime (sura 2:196).






- Some Muslims would include a sixth pillar, Holy Struggle (*Jihad*).
 - This struggle could be internal (a struggle in the soul to do the right thing) or external (an effort against the enemies of Islam).
 - The interpretation of jihad can determine the difference between moderate and radical Muslims.


Ayatollah Khomeini, "Jihad means the conquest of non-Muslim territory. The domination of Koranic law from one end of earth to the other is...the final goal...of this war of conquest.



Paul Fregosi, Jihad in the West, "The jihad war of conquest is a historical reality that has lasted so far for 1,300 years. The purpose of the Jihad became, and still is, to expand and extend Islam until the whole world is under Muslim rule. The Jihad is essentially a permanent state of hostility that Islam maintains against the rest of the world, with or without fighting, for more sovereignty over more territory.



Therefore, when ye meet the Unbelievers (in fight), smite at there necks; at length, when ye have thoroughly subdued them, bind a bond firmly (on them): thereafter (is the time for) either generosity or ransom: until the war lays down its burdens.






Contradicts History



Sura 4:157

"And for claiming that they killed the Messiah, Jesus, son of Mary, the messenger of GOD. In fact, they [speaking of the JEWS] never killed him, they never crucified him - they were made to think that they did. All factions who are disputing in this matter are full of doubt concerning this issue. They possess no knowledge; they only conjecture. For certain, they never killed him."



Evidence for the Resurrection



Simon Greenleaf, Royal Professor of law at Harvard University, examined the value of the historical evidence for the resurrection of Jesus Christ to ascertain the truth. This noted legal authority came to the conclusion that, according to the laws of legal evidence used in courts of law, "There is more evidence for the historical fact of the resurrection of Jesus Christ than for just about any other event in history."

4 Weaknesses with the Quran

Internal Inconsistencies




The Qur'an teaches that Noah and all of his family survived the flood in one place (Sura 21:76), but in another place it states that one of Noah's sons drowned (Sura 11:42-43)

The Qur'an states that Pharaoh drowned (Sura 28:40 and others 17:103, 43:55) but in another place it says say that he survived (Sura 10:90-92).

The Continuity of the Bible


66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, on 3 different continents.

What is more, this collection of books shares a **common storyline-** the creation, fall, and redemption of God's people; a **common theme-** God's universal love for all of humanity; and a **common message-** salvation is available to all who repent of their sins and commit to following God with all of their heart, soul, mind and strength.





KEY WRITINGS

- Writings of Bahá'u'lláh and 'Abdu'l-Bahá:
 - Kitáb-i-Aqdas ("Most Holy Book")
 - Kitáb-i-Iqán
 ("Book of Certitude")
- The Bible, interpreted spiritually to conform to Bahá'í theology

- WHO IS GOD?
- God is an unknowable divine being who has revealed himself through nine "manifestations" (religious leaders), including:
 - Moses
 - Buddha
 - Jesus
 - Muhammad
 - Bahá'u'lláh
 - and others
- No Trinity







WHO IS JESUS?

- Bahá'ís teach that Jesus is one of many manifestations of God.
 - Each manifestation supersedes the previous, giving new teachings about God.
- Jesus, who superseded Moses, was superseded by Muhammad, and most recently by the greatest, Bahá'u'lláh ("Glory of Allah").







WHO IS JESUS?

- He is not God and did not rise from the dead.
- He is not the only way to God.
- He has returned to earth in the form of Bahá'u'lláh.







WHO IS THE HOLY SPIRIT?

- Holy Spirit is divine energy from God that empowers every manifestation.
- "Spirit of Truth" refers to Bahá'u'lláh.





HOW TO BE SAVED

Faith in the manifestation of God (Bahá'u'lláh).

Knowing and living by Bahá'u'lláh's principles and teachings.





WHAT HAPPENS AFTER DEATH

Personal immortality based on good works, with rewards for the faithful.

Heaven and hell are conditions, not places.





BAHÁ'Í WORLD FAITH OTHER BELIEFS AND PRACTICES

- Bahá'í faith originated as an Islamic sect and is severely persecuted in Iran.
- Bahá'í faith teaches that all religions have the same source, principles, and aims.
- Stress on oneness and world unity.



BAHÁ'Í WORLD FAITH OTHER BELIEFS AND PRACTICES


- Regular local gatherings called "feasts"
- Administrative meetings called "spiritual assemblies"
- "Universal House of Justice" in Haifa, Israel is the ultimate governing body.

WHO IS GOD?

- Officially, there is one God, Allah, as described in the Qur'an
- Elijah Muhammad's teachings are also true:
 - God is a black man
 - Millions of Allahs have lived and died since creation
 - Collectively the black race is God
 - Master Fard is the Supreme Allah and Saviour









WHO IS JESUS?

- Officially, Jesus is a sinless prophet of Allah
- Privately, Jesus was born from adultery between Mary and Joseph, who was already married to another woman
- Jesus was not crucified, but stabbed in the heart by a police officer









- Jesus is still buried in Jerusalem
- Prophecies of Jesus' return refer to Master Fard, Elijah Muhammad, or to Louis Farrakhan









WHO IS THE HOLY SPIRIT?

- The Holy Spirit is not significant to this belief
- The Holy Spirit is generally regarded as the power of God
- Occasionally, the Holy Spirit is regarded as the angel Gabriel who spoke to the prophet Muhammad







HOW TO BE SAVED

- People sin, but are not born sinful
- Salvation is through submission to Allah and good works
- Older beliefs still held:
 - **■** Fard is the saviour
 - Salvation comes from knowledge of self and realizing that the white race are devils who displaced the black race







WHAT HAPPENS AFTER DEATH

- There is no consciousness or any spiritual existence after death
- Heaven and Hell are symbols
- Statements about the resurrection refer to awakening "mentally dead" people by bringing them true teachings








OTHER BELIEFS AND PRACTICES

- Farrakhan's public messages coexist with earlier, esoteric doctrines
- Elijah Muhammad's older views (such as polytheism, God as the black race, Master Fard as Allah incarnate, whites as devils bred to cause harm) are still distributed, but public preaching now focuses on Islamic themes (one eternal God, non-racial emphasis) with frequent use of the Bible
