

We see Jesus depicted in the Scriptures as a lion and also as a lamb. The images speak of His mission and reign. He is the Lion, the



In Revelation chapter five the apostle John weeps much because there is no one who is found worthy to take the seven-sealed scroll and open it. The scroll represents the title deed to all of God's creation, including mankind. John weeps because there is no one who can save humanity. BUT - one of the elders came to John and said,

"Do not weep. Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the scroll . . ."

This reference to Jesus goes back to Jacob's prophecy in Genesis 49 about his son Judah. From Judah would come the kingly line of David. It was a prediction that the Messiah, the Savior, would come from the line of David and He would ultimately be King over all the earth - the King over all kings.

But before He came as 'the Lion', He would come as 'the Lamb'. The image of the lamb is that of a sacrifice. In Israel, animals would be sacrificed to make atonement for sin. It was a substitutionary system that God set up for them - life for life. If a man sinned, the penalty would be death. God instituted the sacrificial system so that an animal could die in place of the sinner, bringing forgiveness to the one who deserved death. This is why Jesus is referred to as the Lamb. John the

Baptist said of Jesus in

John 1:29, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

Jesus came as the Lamb at His first coming to deal with the issue of sin so that through faith in Jesus we could be forgiven of all the sin we have committed. He died as a substitute, instead of us dying and being separated from God forever. Jesus will come again, though, and at His second coming He will come as the Lion - the King of kings and Lord of lords.

In this Christmas season we remember that Jesus came to this earth to save us from our sin. We look forward to His soon return, when He will rule and reign forevermore - the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Son of God Who takes away the sin of the world.
