

COVID-19 has certainly shaken up our world. Around the globe many people are realizing that those material things that they typically put their trust in no longer offer the security they once did. Our Men's retreat in February was a great success with about 2 dozen men in attendance. We strengthened ourselves spiritually through worship, 4 Bible studies in the Sermon on the Mount, two guided devotionals, and rich fellowship. Especially powerful was our communion service where we literally nailed our sins and worries to a cross and turned them over to Jesus in prayer. Looking back,



we are all thankful for this time of spiritual revitalization as little did we realize the challenges that would soon be placed on us as leaders of our families, our church, and our community.
